

C: Announcement of Merit Scholarship List

Gyanalok Trust is delighted to declare the names of twelve meritorious students selected for its Merit-cum-Need Based Scholarship for the academic year 2025–26. These students, chosen after a rigorous review of their academic performance financial background, represent spirit and the determination, resilience, and aspiration that Gyanalok aims to nurture. The selected scholars include students pursuing Plus Two and Plus Three studies across various government and aided institutions. Among the twelve, five students have been selected for Plus Two education—three entering their first year and two in their second year. The remaining seven students will receive support for their Plus undergraduate studies, including first-year entrants and continuing students. The selection process involved careful assessment of academic records, socio-economic conditions, and recommendations from educational institutions. The scholars will receive financial assistance covering tuition fees, books, and essential learning materials, enabling them to GYANALOK continue their education without disruption.
